Deir Ezzor. Khalid arrived in Moria only two days before DW met him, yet it's clear to him already that they have a long way to go before they can leave. 



'In the early hours of September 4, two dinghies landed on the northern shores of Lesbos carrying 81 people from Afghanistan: 22 men, 19 women, 40 children.

Several hours later Frontex, the EU's border agency, brought 40 people to the port of Skala Sikamineas; a small village in northern Lesbos where thousands of people pass through on their way to Europe. As they disembarked the boat their faces told a story of fear and exhaustion. Covered in emergency foil blankets they walked shivering towards the designated area in which volunteers distributed water and food and the authorities separated women and children from men in order to take them to Stage 2, a transit camp where people go before they are transferred to Moria.'



more than, the Greek Government must decide to move residents deemed among the most vulnerable to mainland Greece that has bring the populations down, but it's still well above the suspensed maximum capacity of many people.the reason why so many migrants and refugees are packed into Moria camp is due to the Europe Union hotspots policies. Lesvose has been designed as a so called hotspot, where identification and asylum requests arw concentrated.so while in (2015)migrants and refugees moved off from this island quickly. Most now have to stay while their asylum applications are processed, this can take months or more than a year. as a journalist I don't feel safe at night and during the day. I live in Moria camp about one year and four weeks. but at night people drink alcohol and come inside.last week previously a 15 year old Afghan boy dead. nevertheless many don't feel safe it is dangerous. if someone is drinking he's no longer himself.everyday was fighting inside the camp.the main section of the camp is split into separate areas for families and single under age , camp residents who come from over different countries like Afghanistan. Iran. etc...are familiar with the pharse (Moria No Good) they repeat it in English and own language.the miserable living conditions are a source of constant. criticsm by international humanitarian organizations working on this island. On Thursday 29th of August 2019, a total of 17 boats arrived in Lesvos, carrying refugees fleeing violence.

According to Aegean Boat Report, 13 boats arrived all within 30 minutes - this has not happened since 2015. The 13 boats were crammed with 546 people.




Around 17.20, several boats was spotted on it's way towards Skala, soon it was clear that 13 boats had past in to Greek waters.


MoChara, the rescue boat from Refugee Rescue, guided the boats in towards a safe landing spot in the outskirts of Skala Sykamineas called stage 1, where shore response teams from Lighthose Relief

Total number of people from the 13 boats was 547 people. Earlier today, 03.30, a boat carrying 31 people was picked up outside Molivos, Lesvos north by HCG. Reports on one boat that landed in Skala Mistegnon and one in Thermi earlier today, no numbers available at this time. This brings today's arrivals on Lesvos up to 16 boats and approximately 650 people. Also reports on a boat picked up east of Kos by HCG 10.10. 20 people Numbers not confirmed. 






The Kitrinos team were deeply saddened to hear of the 11th of June shipwreck in Lesvos, which tragically took the lives of five adults and two children who had attempted to flee persecution from their home countries.

On the 19th of July was the funeral of one of the drowned children, who was only 5 years old. UNHCR facilitated the transportation of the mother of the child and of members of the Congolese community, and Caritas covered the cost of the ceremony.



DIARIO DE UNA VOLUNTARIA EN LESBOS. DIARY OF A VOLUNTEER IN LESVOS MY ROSES.. MIS ROSAS...

Tienen en común que prácticamente todos llegaron sólos a Lesbos..que huían de una muerte segura en su país..exceptuando a una de estas personas, cuentan con más de 70 años, la más anciana 90.. la tristeza y la dura situación por la que atraviesan les hace parecer aún más mayores de lo que són. Una de ellas sólo tiene tres años más que yo..50 y padece problemas de memoria, y post trauma. Una densa catarata en el ojo derecho le produce falta de visón y preocupa a su hija.

Llevamos varios días haciendo el inventario de las tres bases de datos de gafas con las que contamos que nos ayudan a rebajar costes en la compra de nuevas lentes para los pacientes.

Realizando llamadas a los cientos de pacientes que tenemos en lista de espera de las diferentes organizaciónes médicas del campamento de Moria Kitrinos, BRF, Kelpno, MSF, y en Lesbos MDM, Doc Mobile para darles citas. Terminamos la lista de espera de Febrero y comenzamos por la de Marzo..

A la salida de la clínica, voy a visitar a los pacientes que no disponen de número de teléfono, en olive grove ó dentro del campamento. Muchos són niños con estrabismos ó cirugías por impacto de metralla de las bombas..

Llego al ISO box (container), MSF me pasó el informe de un niño de 7 años con miopía...pero mi sorpresa al ver a toda la familia.. 9 en total contando a la abuelita, y dos hermanos más que necesitan visitares.

Me invitan a un té y caramelos..y empiezo a tomar nota para darles las citas.

El padre és profesor..cada día les doy clases a mis hijos aquí..me explica en tono calmado..llevamos 8 meses en el campamento... tuvimos que huir de Afganistan..donde vivíamos los talibanes mataban a todo el mundo...y a los niños sin ningún reparo..una locura..

Me enseñan fotos de como la gente cruza por las montañas de Iran...en pequeños coches sobrecargados dentro del maletero con más de 25 personas..me quedo impactada...durante días caminando con nieve, lluvia, frío..sin agua, ni comida hasta llegar a Turquia..tuvimos suerte de que no nos echaran de nuevo a Afganistan..és cuestión de suerte..

Luego llegó mi madre sóla... me quedo sin palabras... la anciana con más de 70 años está ciega de un ojo debido a una densa catarata y con el otro ojo ve borroso...

Tras muestras de gratitud de la familia, le pido al padre si me acompaña a hablar con otra anciana que siempre está sóla en silla de ruedas porque me parece que tiene problemas de visión y la última vez lloraba desconsoladamente porque le habían robado sus papeles...


Le doy cita.. a la abuelita..ella llegó junto a una hija sordomuda..pero su sueño és reencontrarse con su hija en Alemania..

No deja de cogerme la mano y besármela...gracias por ayudarnos..me dice.. tú nos ayudas y Dios te ayudará... Ojalá!

Inshallah! le digo...sólo le pido a la Divinidad que me siga dando fuerzas para seguir ayudando a más personas. Hoy otra anciana llegó a la clínica y rompió en lágrimas...está sóla..aunque en una de las secciones protegidas de mujeres..se vino abajo en varias ocasiones..mataron a toda su familia..no era capaz de ver con claridad..ni de cerca ni de lejos... le ofrecimos unas gafas de lectura que agradeció, hasta su próxima visita y la despedí con un gran abrazo diciendo que no estaba sóla. Són muchos los ancianos que viven en el campamento, algunos con sus familias pero como hoy, muchos sólos y emocionalmente deprimidos y con perdida de esperanza. Ya tienen todos su cita en los próximos días! Les recibiremos con el cariño y atención que merecen...són corazones valientes...con una resistencia que poca gente joven podría tolerar.. són mis ROSAS. Hay un antes y un después en la vida de estas personas cuando se les dedica la atención no sólo oftalmológica sino la humanidad y el amor, sólo hay que ver las fotos de Papa Musa.. Desde que acompañé a Musa a Atenas a reencontrarse con su hija están siendo unos días muy emotivos y algo tristes para mí..todo se me hace cuesta arriba..mi mente está lleno de pensamientos..donde se entremezclan la alegría, el dolor, la frustración como en una montaña rusa..donde las dudas y a veces falta de esperanza minan mi energía... las ayudas no llegan..las grandes ongs alabando nuestra labor pero con eso no podremos salir adelante con el proyecto.. no sé que hago hago realmente mal..trabajo a destajo..sin contar las horas..debe ser mi apariencia alegre en las fotos, parece que todo le sale redondo a esta chica..deben pensar..tiene todos los apoyos que necesita.. siempre sale sonriendo.. no sé por cuanto tiempo podré sostener esta situación porque LWB necesita optometristas y oftalmólogos, y fondos económicos para continuar con la misión. Nadie puede creerse como puedo hacer ésta labor voluntariamente durante tanto tiempo, sin sueldos ni vacaciones..ni siquiera mi familia... los refugiados a pesar de estar muy agradecidos piensan que estoy loca...y quizás tienen razón... pero sin un poco de locura uno no se lanzaría a misiones como Me frustro...y me vengo abajo por unos momentos...pienso en mis ROSAS... me siento afortunada de poder ayudar a la Humanidad de la forma en la que lo hago..desde el CORAZON...No voy a perder la esperanza...ellos són un gran ejemplo a seguir..ellos no abandonan...yo tampoco lo haré! Human rights organizations regularly call for an end to the policy of 'containment,' and occasionally the government releases people from the very overcrowded camps.'









"The situation in Moria is beyond belief. I've been regularly coming here since 2017 and every time I think that it can't be worse when I next visit. But it is," said Maria**, who works for the Greek Council for Refugees (GCR).

On top of the mud and the cold, other problems include the lack of security (two-thirds of those detained here say they feel unsafe), overcrowding and poor hygiene.

"We are 25 women sleeping in a tent, with a single bathroom, which can also be used by anyone. It's really very dirty but we have to wash in it anyway," said Clara**, a 36-year-old woman originally from Cameroon.

And then, there is a shortage of medical staff.

Most of the time, there is only one doctor on the island, sent by the Greek government. "Seeing a doctor is very difficult, there is only one for the whole camp. You really have to be on the brink of death for them to take care of you," complained 45-year-old Shala** from Afghanistan.'

We hear more and more about the growing demand in Camp Moria for mental health support. That's what makes our work teaching Trauma Tapping Technique, to refugees struggling with anxiety and PTSD, so important. Our team have recognised the demand for this service, and so we continue to have a designated area for practicing TTT in our clinic.



Dear friends,

We have an important update from the ground in Lesvos:

We have recently set up a new clinic in Kara Tepe Camp! This marks the third clinic we have opened on the island of Lesvos.

Kara Tepe, situated between the city of Mytilene and Camp Moria, is a refugee camp reserved for the most vulnerable groups of people, such as families with small children and refugees with disabilities. The camp is smaller than Moria, with a capacity for 1,200 people.

As healthcare providers, we understand the importance of proper nutrition and safe, hygienic facilities in order for our patients to maintain their health and general wellbeing. Living conditions in Kara Tepe are significantly better than in the notorious Camp Moria. The environment is cleaner and residents are housed in isoboxes, and there are no long queues of people waiting hours for food: instead, meals are distributed by the residents themselves with the assistance of staff and volunteers. Furthermore, social facilities, such as play areas

and washrooms, are in much better condition and enable more safety and privacy.

However, despite Kara Tepe's positive attributes, the camp still relies on the assistance of NGOs and charities like us for services like healthcare provision. Our work is a priority in the provisional area in which we operate, and we work alongside Medecins du Monde to provide a 7-day-a-week service to refugees, with MDM working from Mondays to Fridays and Kitrinos covering weekends and holiday shifts.

We see up to 30 people per day in our Kara Tepe clinic, and the majority of our patients are children. People come to the clinic seeking medical advice and urgent care, and the recent harsh winter weather has been particularly tough on camp residents, leading to many complicated respiratory infections. While these types of infections are common and relatively easy to treat for most of us, the story is very different for those living in refugee camps. Due to minimal access to public services like pharmacies, walk-in clinics or supermarkets, coupled with less-than-adequate living conditions, even simple colds and flues can easily become serious. Since setting up the clinic, our doctor has been faced with multiple urgent situations, and without the prompt response of the local ambulance service, some of our most vulnerable patients (such as babies and toddlers) would otherwise have deteriorated to a critical condition with potentially fatal consequences.

Thanks to your donations, we are able to supply medicine to our patients, as well as helping to educate them about the importance of preventative medicine and taking care of one's own health. However, our budget is extremely limited and as such, we must prioritise the most vulnerable: we are able to provide complete treatment to most of our young patients, but we can only offer others treatment for the first few days of their illness, then referring them to other healthcare providers when necessary. As I'm sure you can imagine, it is very difficult to be told that a doctor cannot give you the treatment you need, and as healthcare providers, having to tell patients we can't always give them what they need is a heavy weight to bear.

It is especially heartbreaking when it comes to inadequate funding for life-saving medication for children too young to speak or advocate for themselves. Though our funding situation remains critical, we have a responsibility to continue to serve those who have entrusted us with their care.

We are so grateful to all of those who continue to stand by us and support our work. The amazing people who work and volunteer with us - doctors, directors, co-ordinators, interpreters - simply could not do what they do without the help of people like you, who care about our brothers, sisters and friends in refugee camps as much as we do. 














A big thank you to our team in Lesvos, who have been working in FOUR clinics today:

"Our first shift was in Kara Tepe, after months of working to secure a collaboration with the camp management.

The Ground Team also had a shift in KEELPNO Cabin in Camp Moria, where we responded to an emergency: a 74-year-old woman was having a heart attack, and needed to be rushed to hospital by an ambulance which took 30-minutes to arrive.

While this was happening, the Ground Team was taking a lead in a campaign to treat scabies and raise awareness about chickenpox in the camp. The team checked more than 200 people today, diagnosed 65 people with scabies. Our team gave them treatment, set up appointment to get clothes and appointments for follow-up with our doctors.



We are very proud to announce that the TTT clinic is now officially up and running! We can now offer Trauma/Tension Tapping Technique to stressed and traumatized clients on the spot in a calming environment.

We have been working on TTT outreach over recent months, running workshops for volunteers from Kitrinos and other NGOs, as well as for refugee clients, such as the African men who sadly lost all their belongings, papers and money in the recent Moria fire that destroyed their living quarters.

Life in this notorious refugee camp can be a daily struggle. There is a mental health crisis in Moria, and in the clinic we are regularly faced with people who have suffered unspeakable horrors and have come to us to ask for help and healing.




Due to the difficulty in obtaining diagnostic tests on the weekend, our volunteers have to rule out serious illnesses, like meningitis and tuberculosis.


